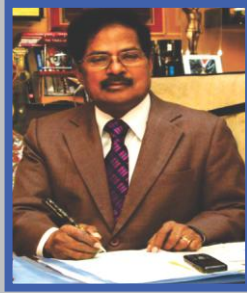

NESHS MINI SCIENCE CENTRE


A Mini Science Centre is established at the school an initiative of M/s STEM Pvt. Ltd., which will encourage the students to learn Science in more simple and effective way.

COLLEGE ADMISSION

Admission to various classes will start after declaration of results of the respective qualifying examination. (Minority quota and Management quota)

1. The application in the prescribed form must be filled in completely and signed by the student and countersigned by his/her parent/ guardian.
2. Students, seeking admission, off line will have to apply in person with the filled in application form for an interview before the admission panel.
3. No admission is valid unless and until it is granted under the authority of the Principal and the full fees are received by the college.
4. All admissions are valid for one academic year only. A student, who is eligible for admission to the next higher class will have to submit a fresh application in the prescribed format.
5. A student admitted to the college shall pay the full fees for two terms. Once admitted to the college, he/she will be considered duly enrolled for the whole academic year though payment is to be made in 2 terms separately.
6. For admission to any class, the following certificates and documents must be produced
 - a) Original School Leaving Certificate.
 - b) Original Mark sheet of S.S.C./I.C.S.E./C.B.S.E Board or any other equivalent qualification.
 - c) One Xerox copy of the mark sheet.
 - d) A Student passing an examination other than the S.S.C. Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education, must obtain an Eligibility Certificate from Bombay Divisional Board.
 - e) Students of Foreign Nationality – Application for admission from foreign nationals must be accompanied by a clearance certificate from the Indian High Commission / Embassy and another clearance certificate from their respective country's High Commission/Embassy in India.
7. Admissions will be provisional until all the necessary certificates are submitted to the college.

EVS PROJECT

In the present days, the environment is heavily outraged due to many ignorant activities of the people and it is seriously affecting our health. Accordingly, a study on environment has become inevitable. Following the Education Department's dictum an additional subject of "EVS" has been introduced, envisaging submission of project by each student on Environment.

BRITISH COUNCIL DIPLOMA COURSES

English proficiency Classes are conducted with the aim of improving the standard of English. This forum provides an opportunity for expressing their skills and makes them familiar with English literature. The association conducts various competitions like self composed poetry, elocution, talk shows, camps, debates, "what's the good word" etc. to bring out their latent talents. British Council Diploma Courses are conducted to impart the required speaking expertise to be more useful while on foreign lands. These courses which are linked to the world famous Cambridge ESOL Examinations, encourage the students to develop a positive attitude to language learning.

FIRST AID & FIRE PRECAUTION

Fire – extinguishers and first aid boxes are provided in each lab in addition to display of safety regulations to be adhered to strictly, as steps necessary for risk mitigation of students.

FIRST AID TRAINING

As a highly useful preventive measure against risks of accidents and sudden ailments, training in first aid is given by a team of doctors from Wockhardt Hospital to the lecturers. Lecturers in turn conduct regular classes in "First Aid" for the students.

DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Accident and disaster cannot be predicted and when they befall, people become perplexed. The institution has, therefore, decided to train up the students in disaster management as would be compatible for students to handle, like first aid, accidents, flood, fire, earthquake and physical/mental assaults.

COMPUTERISED PROGRESS REPORT

The results of the examinations entered in the Progress Reports are intended to appraise parents/guardians of the progress and conduct of their wards. The college authorities will hand over the Progress Report to every student immediately after announcement of the results, which are to be shown to the parents / guardians.

The parents / guardians are earnestly requested to observe the following. :-

1. Ensure that these reports are brought to them invariably and returned to college authorities within three days. Students who do not return the Progress Reports without signature of their parents/guardians within the specified period are liable to be sent back home.
2. Go through the Progress Report carefully and affix their signature wherever required in

affirmation of their perusal, and

3. Take effective remedial steps in case the student is found to be weak in any subject or the student's attendance, conduct and behaviour is reported to be unsatisfactory.

R & D ACTIVITIES

NES believes, the future of the nation rests on its teaching faculty. Subscribing to this Philosophy, it has established a National Research & Development Centre in Education, Science & Technology and a NES Staff Training College. Through several seminars, workshops, symposia hosted by the R & D Centre and Training College, NES has been developing its teaching faculty with research orientation and applying the products of this research work to all its Institutions. This has enormously helped NES in attaining the finest standard of quality. NES has also been actively co-ordinating all R & D exercises of the Centre, like organizing 'National Award Contests and Seminars', which are being held annually for inspiring qualitative improvement of the teaching community of the country.

WELFARE SERVICES

A) COUNSELLING

In order to deal with the problems of overactive and problematic students, a qualified and competent counselor has been appointed. While the college itself will make efforts to identify such cases and take remedial measures, parents who feel necessary can approach the Counsellor with problems faced by their wards.

B) DIETICIAN

A qualified 'Dietician' is always available. She arranges Guest Lectures/ Seminars/Workshops etc. on "Balanced Diet" and "Maintenance of good Health" for students, parents and lecturers. She is available for free counselling to students, parents and lecturers between 11.00 a.m. and 12.00 noon in the college premises.

C) NES MEDICAL CENTRE

Apart from periodical medical check up of the students by experts, treatment is also offered by a team of well qualified doctors associated with our NES Medical Centre. The doctor issues report on each student, which is sent to the parent/guardian for their follow – up action in consultation with the doctors.

D) CANCER DETECTION CENTRE

Cancer being a dreaded disease, our Education Society, in its concern to stave off the disease from our entire NES family, has been holding in association with Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai, Cancer Detection Camps every year, giving a check up for all its students, teachers and interested parents.

E) GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The students can register their complaints / grievances / suggestions, if any, with the Grievance Redressal Cell established in the college. The representative of the cell shall investigate into the complaints/grievances on the basis of evidence tendered before the authority and recommend remedial measures.

F) FEED-BACK SCHEME

A feedback scheme has been introduced in the college offering scope to parents and students to submit suggestions / complaints which are analysed and valued ones are acted upon.

COLLEGE TRADITIONS

1. To be always friendly with one another
2. To ensure decency in talk and behaviour
3. To accept whatever work is assigned as sacred duty
4. To help any unattended visitor met in the college premises
5. To show respect when any lecturer or visitor enters and also leaves the classroom.
6. To be courteous and sportsman-like at all times.
7. To protect the library and laboratory and respect the rights of the boys and girls using it.
8. To maintain and enrich the aesthetic beauty of the college premises and report any damage observed.
9. To avoid throwing any waste in the college premises. Arrange to remove any litter dropped by others.
10. To observe good manners on all occasions.

These traditions are little things in themselves. Enforced from outside they lose their value. The desire to observe them must come from within and must be wholehearted and genuine, only then one's character can fully blossom.

DISCIPLINE

The college believes in maintaining discipline, which is not regimental or oppressive. Students are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and poise, be polite and courteous to their lecturers and elders, kind and co-operative with their fellow students. Parents' co-operation with the college is inevitable in helping their children develop into worthy citizens of tomorrow.

ATTENDANCE

All students are expected to be in the college premises at least 10 minutes before the commencement of the classes. If late, they should get a permit chit from the supervisor/lecturer-in-charge before they go to their classes.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Courtesy and respect must be the key aspects of pupils' behaviour. Disrespect and disobedience may result in disciplinary action, involving suspension or even expulsion.
2. Students are expected to greet all visitors and members of the staff with respect. They should always remember that the college is judged by their conduct. Any serious breach of discipline and courtesy, as also disrespect to the members of the college staff, will be treated as serious and students responsible for such misbehaviour will be punished and may lead to summary dismissal.
3. Silence must be maintained in the classrooms during periods and even in-between periods.
4. Scribbling on the walls and desks etc. should be avoided. If any student is found to scribble on the walls/ desks, fine will be collected and contributed to the Students' Welfare Fund.
5. All students are responsible to the college authorities for their behaviour both inside and outside the college, both individually and collectively. Any reported or observed objectionable conduct outside the college on the part of the students shall also render them liable for disciplinary action.
6. It is important for the parents/ guardians to note that the reputation of the college is very much

dependent on the conduct of its students. They are, therefore, to ensure that their wards exhibit a decent conduct not only inside but also outside the college campus, since the students on their turn will be liable for disciplinary action for any reported or observed misconduct inside or outside the college campus.

7. Students must wear decent dresses. Girl students are not allowed to wear short and tight dresses in the college.
8. All class representatives and volunteers must be given due respect.
9. All Students should be particular about cleanliness of the college. They should use the baskets and the bins specially provided for litters.
10. Students from one class are not allowed to visit or be in any other class room during the recess time.
11. Habitual idleness, late attendance, willful disobedience and misconduct, individually or collectively, will be seriously dealt with.
12. Students are not allowed to bring any outsider for any of the college functions etc. Only parents / guardians are allowed to attend the college function on the strength of the invitation extended to them. Suitable disciplinary action will be taken against those students, who are found to violate this rule.
13. Students suffering from diseases declared infectious by a registered Medical Practitioner and which requires quarantine or segregation will not be permitted to attend the college without being certified as cured by the same Medical Practitioner.
14. Students are responsible for the safe custody of their books and other belongings. They are requested not to wear gold / silver ornaments, for the sake of their personal safety.
15. Apart from their text books, students are not permitted to bring any objectionable or indecent books, magazines, newspapers, periodicals, or similar articles into the college premises. Detection of any publication lacking decency and decorum will entail disciplinary action.
16. Parents or guardians are given to understand that they cannot dictate to the management and the management has a right to say on what conditions they will admit or retain students in the institution such conditions being in conformity with the instructions issued by the appropriate Education Authority from time to time.
17. Any student, who is persistently insubordinate or is repeatedly or willfully mischievous or is guilty of malpractices in connection with examinations or has committed an act of serious indiscipline and / or misbehaviour, or who, in the opinion of the Head of the Junior College has an unwholesome influence on his fellow students, may be expelled or suspended from the college for specified period.
18. Insubordination and indecent language or conduct are sufficient reasons for the expulsion of a student.
19. Daily attendance and punctuality are compulsory requirements.
20. If a student is found to be in possession of any copy material, he / she will be sent out of the examination hall and will be deemed to have failed in the examination. Copying, smuggling of answer book, forgery etc., will entail detention in the same class or even expulsion from the college.

21. Students should note that use of tobacco in any form is strictly prohibited within the entire NES premises. Anybody, violating this restriction will be liable to be expelled from the college.
22. No student is allowed to indulge in any political activity or in any activity, detrimental to the interest of the college.
23. No student/ teacher shall collect any money without the written permission of the Principal.
24. No notice shall be put up on the notice-board, including black-board without the written permission of the Principal, officials or faculty member authorized in this regard.
25. All programmes, meetings, gatherings, picnics, hiking, etc. will be conducted only with the prior written approval of the Chairman, College Committee / Principal of the college.
26. Students shall closely observe and abide by the rules and regulations relating to discipline and decorum. Violations and / or lapses will be dealt with severely. For this purpose nominated senior staff members function as the “Unfair Means Inquiry Committee”. This Committee will inquire into complaints regarding all kinds of misconduct on the part of the students and decide upon ways and means to deal with specific cases. In this process, parents may be invited to be present at the time of inquiries.
27. Complaints, if any, should be made to the Headmistress / Supervisor / Lecturer-in-charge and no criticism thereon should be resorted to.
28. Suggestions from parents / guardians are welcome. A register to record suggestions / complaints is available with the counter clerk.
29. Parents / Guardians are expected to fully co-operate with the college in the interest of their wards and for this they are to liaise with the college authorities.
30. Students should make themselves familiar with the college rules and regulations concerning them and also with the restriction and notices issued from time to time by the college.
31. Students joining the college and parents admitting their wards are by that very fact, deemed to accept and abide by all the rules and regulations of the institution to the entire satisfaction of the college authorities.
32. The attention of parents/guardians is particularly invited to the fact that the management shall be free to modify or alter all or any of these rules at any time and notify the changes.
- 33. Students should not use / carry mobile phones inside the college premises.**
34. It is to be noted that in case of expulsion of any student from the college, the cause of expulsion will be cited in his / her L.C.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Leave of absence should be obtained from the Supervisor/lecturer-in-charge by producing a letter from the parent/guardian. Students will not be allowed to remain absent without sufficient reason and without authorization from parent/guardian.

IDENTITY CARD

Every bonafide student shall obtain identity card carrying his/her latest photograph and bearing the signature of Principal. It is the duty of the student to collect the identity card issued by the college at the beginning of the first term. This card must be produced whenever demanded by the teaching / non-teaching staff. In case of loss of identity card it should be reported to the college immediately. A duplicate card can be obtained paying an amount of Rs. 25/-.

COLLEGE PROPERTY

Any damage to the college property, whether inside the classroom or outside, will have to be made good by those responsible or by their parents or guardians. If the damage is found to be done by the student willfully, appropriate disciplinary action will also be taken against the student besides recovery of the cost of the damage. If the student causing the damage is untraced a general fine will be collected to make good the damages. The decision of the college authorities regarding the responsibility of damage and compensation payable to the college will be final and binding.

EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION

Eligibility :

A student attending the Junior College shall be eligible to appear for the final examination held at the end of the academic year on fulfilling the following conditions :-

- a. He should have-attended at one or more recognized Junior Colleges with not less than 75% of the working days in each of two terms.
- b. The periods from the opening day of the academic year to the 30th of October, 2017 and from 10th November to the 1st May, 2018 constitute the two terms.
- c. A student who does not fulfil the requirement of the minimum attendance of 75% separately in two terms, as stated above, and whose deficiency is not condoned and thus not admitted to the examination or whose very application for admission to the examination is not accepted/forwarded by the Head of the Junior college on account of deficiency in attendance or whose application was withdrawn under regulation 93(8) shall have to make up the deficiency in attendance before appearing in the next exam.

Either

During the first part of the next academic year, if he intends to appear for the examination in the following October or November.

OR

- i) During the first or second or both parts of the next academic year, if he intends to appear at the examination in the following March or April. (Refer to rule 88 of the M.S. Board Examination - 1977)
- ii) Two Unit Tests and two Semester Examinations will be conducted during the course of the year. Students remaining absent from the examination, except on medical ground, will not be re-examined. As per Rules, 75% attendance is required to be eligible to appear for each Semester Examination

ADMISSION GUIDELINES AND SUBJECTS OFFERED.

Students are admitted by the College to the First Year Junior College (F.Y.J.C) on the basis of merit. Students with high academic standard in the S.S.C Examinations conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination are preferred. Students are also admitted through online allotment by the Education Department. Admissions are also given under Minority & In-house quota as per the norm.

As per the guidelines by Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education. Students securing less than 40% marks in the Science subject at X standard Examination are not eligible for admission to FYJC(Science).

Students who have passed the ICSE/CBSE or any other examination conducted by any statutory Board other than the Maharashtra State Board must obtain a form for eligibility from the Mumbai Divisional Board Office before seeking admission to the F.Y.J.C class.

NOTE: Students seeking admission to F.Y.J.C Class should submit;

1. Original S.S.C/ ICSE/CBSE or any other equivalent examination Mark sheet and two attested xerox copies.
2. Original School Leaving Certificate and two attested xerox copies.
3. Migration Certificate/ Transfer Certificate by ICSE /CBSE/ Other State Board Students.
4. One attested xerox copy of Ration Card by girl students.
5. Caste Certificate, if any.

Note: the Original School Leaving Certificate shall be retained by the college as a permanent record as per the norm while original S.S.C. marksheet shall be returned to the students after verification.

Students of Foreign Nationality

Application for admission from foreign nationals must be accompanied by a clearance certificate from the Indian High Commission and another clearance certificate from their Country's Embassy in India.

BIFOCAL SUBJECTS: (Electronics & Computer Science for Science Stream Banking & Office Management for Commerce Stream)

50 Seats are available for each of these two subjects. Each of these two subjects has two papers and these two papers in any one of the two subjects are offered against Hindi & Biology. IT which has only one paper is offered against Hindi (Total 60 seats are available for IT) Office Management & Banking offer 25 seat for each Subject.

Issue of Certificates

1. Application for Leaving Certificate (L.C) should be submitted duly signed by the parent / Guardian before 30.4.2017 and the applicants should contact the college office after 2 days to collect the certificate.
2. Duplicate Leaving Certificate will be used only if an affidavit is produced by the parent/ Guardian along with sufficient evidence to prove that the original one is lost.
3. Bonafide Certificate or any other certificate shall be issued to the student against a written application in the prescribed form available in the college office.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF EXAMINATIONS

A candidate attending the Junior College classes, shall be eligible to appear for examinations on fulfilling the following conditions.

1. He/ she should have attended not less than 75% of the lectures /tutorials/ practicals held in each of the two terms. A candidate who does not fulfill the minimum attendance of 75% separately as stated above and whose deficiency is not condoned will not be admitted to the examination. The Examination form of such candidates will be withdrawn under Regulation 93 (8). The candidate may make up the deficiency in attendance.

Either

a) During the first part of the next academic year, if the student intends to appear for the examination in the following

October or November.

OR

b) During the first or second or both parts of the next academic year, if the student intends to appear for the examination in the following Feb. or March.

Two Units Tests/ Internal Assessments and two Semester Examinations will be held in the course of the First year. A student who remains absent from any examination, except on a medical ground, will not be re-examined. While the college conducts all the F.Y.J.C examinations, the final S.Y.J.C examination is conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education. However all S.Y.J.C. students will have to appear for unit test I & II/ Internal Assessment I & II, First Semester & Preliminary Examinations conducted by the college before they appear for the Final Examination conducted by the Board.

Attendance for each examination is compulsory.

Verification of Marks

If, after the declaration of results, a parent or guardian desires Verification of his ward's marks in the FYJC, Annual Examination in any subject, he may apply in the prescribed form available in the college office along with the prescribed fee to the Principal, within 15 days from the date of declaration of result. In scrutiny, only the totals are rechecked and it is also ensured that all questions have been assessed. The results of the scrutiny will be communicated to the parent or guardian immediately after the reopening of the college in June. Verification does not mean or include re-assessment or reevaluation.

Progress Report

The result of the examinations entered in the progress Report (Mark Sheet) is intended to appraise parents/ guardians of the progress and conduct of their ward. The college authorities will show this to the parent during the open day kept to announce the result.

The parents/ guardians re earnestly requested to:

- 1) Attend the Open Day date is communicated through their ward/ through Communication Book
- 2) Go through the report carefully and affix their signature wherever required in token of their perusal.
- 3) Take effective remedial measures in case the student is found to be weak in any subject or the student's attendance, conduct and behavior are reported unsatisfactory. If a candidate appears in all subjects and fails in one or more subjects his deficiency of marks in maximum 3 subjects shall be condoned for the purpose of passing the examination.

PROMOTION RULES FOR FYJC (Revised w.e.f. 2016-17)

1. A student should score minimum 35% marks in each subject including EVS in order to be declared passed in F.Y.J.C Examination, provided he/ she has also cleared Physical & Health Education Examinations.
2. If a student has scored 35% marks but not cleared Physical & Health Education Examination, he/she will be declared failed.
3. If a candidate appears in all subjects and fails in one or more subjects his /her deficiency of marks in maximum 3 subjects & maximum 15 marks shall be condoned for the purpose of passing the examination.
4. Although maximum 10 marks condonation is to be given in one subject such concession should not exceed the required minimum percentage of passing in the subject i.e.35%

5. There shall not be any concession of ATKT.
6. All the practicals prescribed for the course should as far as possible be completed by the student. However they should not be allowed to appear for the practical examinations and the marks for the Journal should not be given if the students fail to perform practicals prescribed for the course.
7. No candidate should be promoted to the next higher standard if he/ she fails even after applying the rule of giving the benefit of condonation of marks as provided in the rules of condonation No.3.
8. There shall not be a re-examination in the case of failed students.
9. In the case of students who could not appear at the first or second term end examination for genuine reasons, due to ill health (on producing a medical certificate in time) or such other reason beyond his/her control (such as natural calamities) the Head of the Junior College shall hold the first- term- end examination as early as possible, but in any case before the end of the second term. However second-term-end-examination in case of such student should be conducted immediately after the second-term- end-examination. Such concession should not be given in case of students absent during the yearly work.
10. The procedure for conducting the examination mentioned under Rule No.9 will be the same, as for the second- term- end- examination. However. the question papers of the examination should be different from that set at the first/ second-term-end- examination. The question papers and the assessed answer books of all examinations of all students should be preserved for one year for inspection by the Education office/ Dy. Director.
11. The result of the re-examination should be declared within a week's time so as to enable the successful student to seek admission in the Second Year of the Junior College.
12. There shall be no extras fees for the re-examination of student.
13. The students who pass the F.Y.J.C.(Std. XI) examination will be awarded the following Grades.

Grade I (With Distinction): To Successful candidates who obtain not less than 75% marks in the aggregate , calculated on the basis of the six (in case of vocational subject) or seven subjects offered for the examination.

Grade II To successful candidates who obtain less than 75% but not less than 60% of marks in the aggregate calculated on the basis of the six (in case of vocational subject) or seven subjects offered for the exam.

Grade III To successful candidates who obtain not less than 45% marks but less than 60% of marks in the aggregate calculated on the basis of the six (in case of vocational subject) or seven subjects offered for the examination.

Grades pass To all other successful candidates.

Provided that the First (with distinction) or First or Second Grade shall not be awarded to a candidate who appears for the examination with any exemption or exemptions claimed by him/her. Provided further that, the aggregate total of marks obtained by a candidate is less than the total of marks required the obtaining the first grade, but not more than 3 marks, candidate shall be given the necessary grace marks not exceeding computing his aggregate of marks for the purpose of award of the First grade.

NB: In case there is any change in the promotion rule made by the Board during the year, Students/ Parents will be accordingly intimated.

WITHDRAWAL AND REFUND OF FEES

1. Application for leaving Certificate should be submitted duly signed by the parent/ guardian and the applicant should call at the college office after a week to collect it.
2. Duplicate Leaving Certificate will be issued only if an affidavit is produced by the parent/ guardian, along with sufficient documentary evidence to prove that the original one has been lost.
3. If a student informs the institution in writing before the commencement of the academic year that he / she wants to withdraw for any reasons, the tuition fee, term fee, laboratory fee, library and laboratory deposits (if any) actually collected from the student will be refunded. The admission fee will be retained by the institution.
4. If a student desires to withdraw his/her name and applies for refund of fees after the commencement of the academic year, the admission fee, term fee, and laboratory fee (if any), in full and also the proportionate amount of tuition fee till the month in which the refund is claimed will be deducted, the remaining amount of tuition fee alone will be refunded.

1. All kinds of fee concessions will be granted only to eligible students, subject to satisfactory conduct, attendance and progress.
2. Students belonging to B. C., O.B.C., children of secondary school staff, primary teachers and Freedom fighters will be granted concession/freeship according to the Government Rules in force, from time to time.
3. To avail the above facility, the prescribed form should be filled in and submitted to the office before the stipulated date. Incomplete forms or forms submitted after the due date will not be accepted.

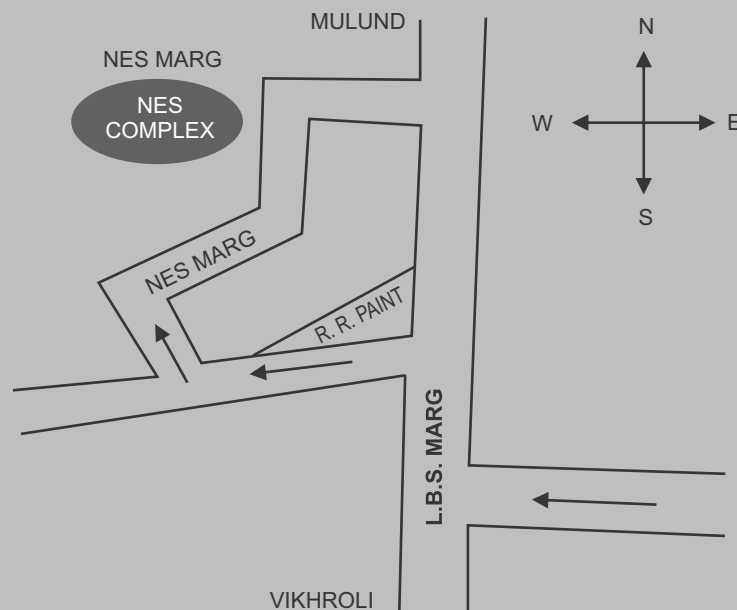
